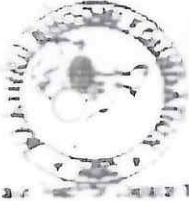

“VOCATIONAL AND SKILL TRAINING FOR WOMEN LIVING IN URBAN SLUMS
approved under section 35AC of the Income Tax Act, 1961”

Goal and objectives of the project : Empowering women by educating and making them economically independent by providing skill training is one of the top priorities of our organization. We want to focus on the basic course which is for six months. And for those interested in working outside we have facility for placements, or we can also have them in our various centers, or they can also open their own shops, this is the basic idea. Apart from the basic course the Centre will also have an advanced course facility for women. The training not only helps unemployed people improve their socio-economic standards but it also boosts their self-esteem and confidence. The Housewife who has completed their primary study but could not get any job can utilize this opportunity. We also try to help in getting loans for starting new ventures and vocational training to help them get jobs.

Need of the project with the Data on need assessment/Baselines Survey

Lots of women living in urban slums in Delhi is uneducated, socially and economically weaker section and drop out from the school. This kind of women is mostly depending upon her husband or father for their needs. To alleviate this situation the training centre offers a lot of techno managerial course at our rural branch offices to enable women to start in new enterprises. As such the techno managerial centre creates

entrepreneurial opportunities for women, leading them to enter the rural job market strength economically via communities through micro and small enterprises

In Delhi state, it is estimated that 40% population live in slums & resettlement colonies and there is ever increasing migrating population in Delhi from neighboring states like U.P., Rajasthan, Bihar, etc.. There are a no. of factors responsible for people to come to Delhi like landless labor, poverty, search for better employment income, disorganized families etc. hence, the growth of slums, resettlement colonies, unauthorized colonies remain unchecked. The women in these slums resettlement colonies are the soft targets and easy preys to atrocities, victimization, and unhygienic socio-cultural environments as the slum population is heterogeneous, unorganized and dominated by local politicians. There is lack of proper civic amenities, educational opportunities, proper employment, and recreational facilities

The idea behind this concept is to mobilize women and improve their quality of life. With increasing self reliance women are becoming more confident and independent. An indication of social change is the increasing number of income generating activities being controlled by women. Besides improving the economic standards of life of women, aim at spreading awareness on issues such as literacy, health, nutrition, family welfare, and legal rights through which they can get Empowerment. In order to accomplish this task, individual rural women should improve their awareness levels, communication skills; simple management techniques so that they can improve their confidence, articulate and effectively communicate with their social partners and economic stake holders. This is possible only through a comprehensive training and the training agencies are expected to organize a tailor-made training module to suite individual group and should be able to monitor their effectiveness with a view to improve their focus and quality. That is exactly the reason, various developmental agencies both National and International are according top priority for training of women for their capacity building and several NGOs and social organizations have been engaged to fill the gap through various initiatives of policy and fiscal support. There is a need for undertaking tenacious interventions in the areas of confidence and capacity building of women through specific training modules.

Vision of the project

The vision of this project is to develop capacity building of women who will;

- Have enhanced awareness and improved skills.
- Improving family situation and income.
- Be able to increase Marketing ability of product.
- Through which women living in urban slums can able to get empowerment.

3. Training of Rural women and providing them with techno-managerial support with a view to achieve improved productivity.

5. The Empowerment of Rural Women, especially socially and economically weaker section by ensuring their access to, and control over, resources through a sustained process of mobilization and convergence of all the on-going techno-managerial on- the-job training programs.

6. Physical and Social milestones/deliverables:

Skill development for employability will be used as an agent of change in promoting women's employment. Women face a multitude of barriers in accessing skills and productive employment, remaining on the job due to effect of globalization or otherwise and advancing to higher level jobs, as well as returning to the labour market after a period of absence spent, for example, in raising children.

- a) A policy of non-discrimination will be pursued vigorously to provide equal access for women to skill development and employment.
- b) This Policy will aim to raise women's participation to at least 30% by the end of the 11th Plan.
- c) Proactive measures that overcome barriers and facilitate participation, such as hostels for women, scholarships, transport, training materials and loans, will be made available on a large scale.
- d) The Women's Vocational Training Programme will be expanded and the institutional network providing training facilities exclusively for women, so that they can obtain skills with high wage and self-employment potential, will be greatly expanded.
- e) In order to promote skills and employability of women, the sectors which employ a large number of women will be identified. These may include construction, home-Page 17 based traditional crafts or piece rate work, financial and health service as well as agricultural sectors.
- f) Gender stereotyping in vocational courses will be eliminated to encourage women's participation in non-traditional occupations, including existing and emerging technological fields.

Skills development can help women to gain an in-depth picture of skills shortages and demand within their functional economic area. Having this information and intelligence on a local level can help for implementation skills development strategies that are based on real local need and that address real local issues as well as responding better to employer needs. Many cities are experiencing a paradox in their labour market, with high rates of unemployment alongside talent gaps and unfilled vacancies due to skills mismatches. Having the ability to forecast what skills may be needed in the future will enable to put in place the right training offer to ensure businesses have a suitably skilled workforce to sustain their growth and development.

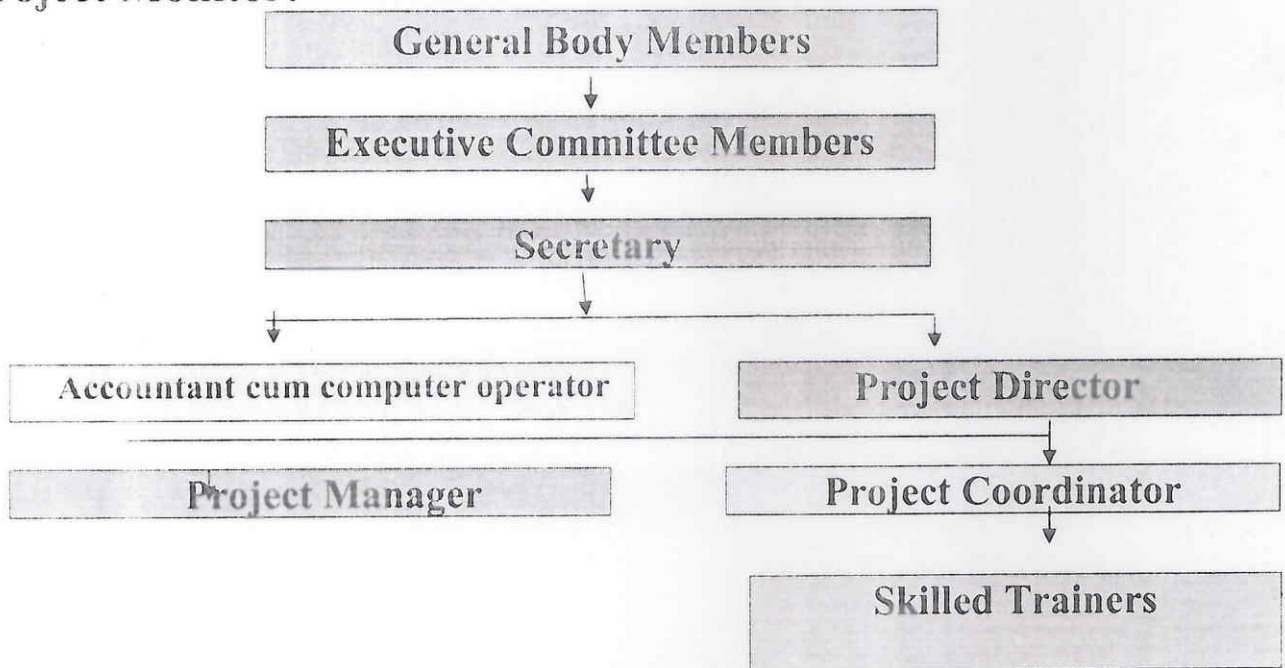

The sample taken from around 174 BPO - IT sector industries of Delhi / NCR (Ghaziabad, Noida, Faridabad, Gurgaon).
- 2. Research Study on impact of Indian Culture on the Youths of Delhi:** Maathru Bhoomi Foundation has conducted research study on impact of Indian Culture on the Youths of Delhi for the period of 6 months. And also the book containing 150 pages has been published with the research data and information gathered during the study. 1. The programme was conducted with huge pomp and show at great success. The programme was inaugurated by the U.V.N, Honble MLA, Yellamanchili.

2. CHILDREN'S DAY ART & CRAFT EXHIBITION BY MAATHRU BHOOMI FOUNDATION: Maathru Bhoomi Foundation (MBF) has organized ART & CRAFT exhibition of pre school children on the occasion of Children's Day. The exhibition was held at the premises of Blooming flowers, G D Colony, Mayur Vihar Phase – III, Delhi -96 on 14th November '2010 from 10 am to 6 pm.

There were 75 art & craft items by children up to 6 years of age from 10 schools of Mayur Vihar. The youngest artist happens to be a three-year-old child whose work of art was also displayed. 4. EDUCATION AWARENESS THROUGH PUPPET SHOWS: MBF has conducted education awareness programme at G D Colony, Mayur Vihar Phase – III, Delhi - 96 to aware and motivate people of the village for education of their wards. With the help of the programme, people came to know the importance of education in one's life and they also started motivated others for the education of the childrens. Our aim is to focus the rural community where there is a large number of illiterate population existence.

5. MOBILE VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTRE FOR MIGRANT WOMEN / URBAN SLUMS: Maathru Bhoomi Foundation has started Mobile Training Centre for Migrant women workers / urban slums women aiming at improving skills of women in urban slums but also help them in fulfilling their basic needs raising their standards of living. Migrant women will get encouragement to start their new lives in very new city which they can't get in present scenario. With the current situation, we concluded that there is an emergent need to motivate these women for vocational training skills as families are seen to be died / facing difficulties mostly due to starvation, less employment opportunities and inadequate assessability.

6. PUPPET SHOW ON ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES AND AWARENESS: Puppet show on environmental issues was organized by MBF and our role towards Environment in our area for the benefits of the Visakhapatnam district for the farmers on 18th July'2010. We have created a sense of awareness towards better environment and also work for the over all development with an objective to awareness for a pollution free environment.

7. RESEARCH STUDY ON UNREGISTERED HONOUR KILLINGS CASES IN DELHI AND ITS IMPACT ON THE SOCIETY: Maathru Bhoomi Foundation (MBF) has conducted research study on unregistered honour killing cases in the state of Delhi and its impact on the society sponsored by various donors from June to September 2010. We reached out to 10,000 people to know the exactly reasons for non registration of the cases in Delhi -NCR. We have approached most of the family members of the victims, their relatives, panchayat, pradhans, religious leaders and media to highlight the issues related to honour killings in the entire coverage area. The report has been submitted to national Commission for Women for necessary action.

8. RESEARCH STUDY ON ENVIRONMENT PROVIDED BY BPOs/ MNCs TO THEIR WOMEN EMPLOYEES: MBF presently working on Research Study on environment provided by the BPOs / MNCs to the working women sponsored by National Commission for women, Government of India covering all Delhi / NCR's (Delhi, Gurgaon, Noida, Faridabad, Ghaziabad) BPOs and MNCs companies. This research study has already been started in December 2010 and suppose to be completed in June 2011.

9. DISTRIBUTION OF RICE AND SUGAR TO THE PERSON BELOW POVERTY LINE: MBF has organized consumer awareness camp at Kothapalem, Andhra Pradesh in August'2010 and also distributed rice to the people below poverty line. Through the awareness camp, we have benefited around 500 peoples and also impart them knowledge about Consumer protection and their rights with the following points:-

a). Making purchasing from authorized dealers, b). Purchasing of company packed items c). Identifications of manufacturing and expiry dates. d). To check the price list displayed on the shop or not. e). To obtain receipt in list of price paid, guarantee/warrant card f). Judge the measurement whether in original form g). To check the maintenance of items sold in loose shape h). To check the adulterations in loose items with simple eyes.

10. SEMINAR ON IMPACT OF RABINDRANATH TAGORE'S NATIONAL ANTHEM ON YOUTH: MBF has taken initiative to spread the importance of national Anthem and conducted Seminar on impact of Rabindranath Tagore's National Anthem on youth on 19th December'2010 in Anakapalle, Andhra Pradesh. We discussed about National Anthem importance and its impact on youth, to educate the next generation on the symbolic importance of the national anthem. We have come to know about the views and impact of National Anthem among the youth by conducting this seminar.

11. SEMINAR ON IMPACT OF DOWRY PROHIBITION ACT: MBF has conducted Seminar on Impact of dowry prohibition act on social change in Yellamanchili, A.P. on 16th May'2010 and discussed about the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 enactment and its implementation. And we also discussed about the numerous cases related to dowry death or harassment on account of dowry which we mostly read in the Newspapers has come to light because of these laws. We make people aware about the importance of these laws which helps a lot of troubled wife or her relatives who are not in a position to complain against the demand for dowry or the taking of dowry. We suggested that the evil of dowry can bring under control to a very great extent by these laws and these laws definitely provide great relief to a wife, if implemented properly.

12. CHILDREN'S LIBRARY: MBF has experience in running of children's library and it has been launched in July'2010 at Pocket B-5, Mayur Vihar Phase – III, Delhi - 96. We got very good response from parents, teachers, children and also it helps in building habit and interest of reading books.

13. SMALL SCALE INVESTOR'S AWARENESS PROGRAMME: Maathru Bhoomi Foundation (NGO) has conducted the Investor Awareness to aware small scale investors on 11th – 12th June '2010 in G D Colony Mayur Vihar Phase – III, Delhi about the investment decisions on awareness and knowledge, and a lack of these may lead to a low profile amongst its peers in the market (i.e., competing businesses and investment opportunities) to the detriment of the business.

14. TRADITIONAL CULTURAL DANCE SHOW: MBF has organized traditional Cultural Dance show in Anakapalle district, A.P. on 2nd May'2010. There were 35 college students participated in the show by performing traditional cultural dances like Kuchipudi, Mathuri, Burra Katha dances, etc. The show was aimed at promotion of Cultural dances of Andhra Pradesh state. The show was grand success which helped in promoting our traditional cultural dances among youths.

15. SEMINAR ON IMPORTANCE OF BOOKS READING FOR CHILDREN & PARENTS: MBF has organized Seminar on Importance of books reading for children and parents to motivate them to make habit of reading on the occasion of P. Jawaharlal Nehru Birth anniversary from 15th – 16th November'2010. Around 250 – 300 children, their parents and teachers participated in the seminar and got motivated. There was also an arrangement of a storytelling to the children for building up their interest in the reading of the books. We got huge response from parents and children that they want programs more to be happen as they are good got their wards future and marked the Seminar a grand success.

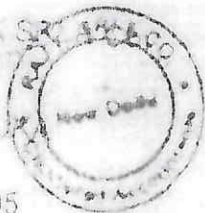
